There will be a substantial prize for the winners, and even, it is rumoured, a huge prize if the Guinness record for the world's heaviest tomato is broken. (Currently 3.52kg)

TOMATO-GROWING COMPETITION

1. The instructions on how to enter, and prizes, form part of the conditions of entry and entry into the Neerim District Agricultural and Horticultural Society tomato growing competition is deemed to be acceptance of the terms and conditions of the Promotion.
2. Entry is open to Australian residents.
3. There will be a Junior Section, open to anyone under 16. All junior entrants are eligible to win Open prizes.
4. To be valid, all entries must be disease free, with no fruit fly or rot. They must be edible but can be any stage from green to ripe.
5. The judging criteria for each class is as follows:

THE HEAVIEST TOMATO

The heaviest tomato shall be that tomato which is a valid entry and whose weight as measured by the judges on the day of competition as the greatest of all entries in this class. If the winning entry is judged to be a world record it will be subject to rules for world records as set by the Guinness World Record organisation.

THE HEAVIEST PAIR OF TOMATOES

The heaviest pair of tomatoes shall be that pair of tomatoes both being valid entries whose weight as measured by the judges on the day of competition is the greatest of all entries in this class.

THE LONGEST TOMATO (measured from stem to bottom)

The longest tomato shall be that tomato which is a valid entry and whose length as measured by the judges on the day of competition is the greatest of all entries in this class.

THE MOST INTERESTING SHAPED TOMATO

The most interesting shaped tomato shall be that tomato which is a valid entry and whose shape as determined by the judges on the day of competition is deemed to be the most interesting of all entries in this class.

THE SMALLEST RIPE TOMATO

A ripe tomato is one that is predominantly of a colour that is consistent with a ripe tomato of the variety entered. Ripe or otherwise shall be determined by the judges on the day of competition. The smallest ripe tomato shall be that tomato which is a valid entry and is determined by the judges to be ripe and whose weight as measured by the judges on the day of competition is the least of all entries in this class.

POTTED PLANT WITH MOST TOMATOES

The plant with the most tomatoes (green or ripe) is deemed the winner

HEAVIEST TRUSS OF TOMATOES (MINIMUM OF 3)

Green or ripe tomatoes acceptable)
